

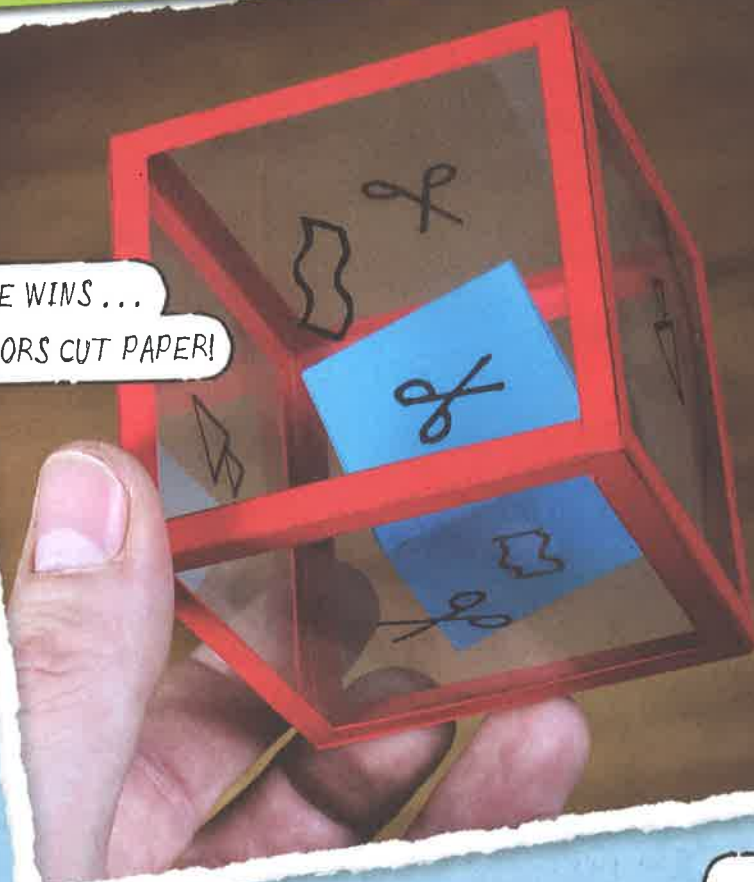
ROCK, PAPER, SCISSORS DICE

LEVEL: **EASY**

1. Measure and mark the cutting plan, on a sheet of red cardstock, as shown.
2. Cut it out using a craft knife, score the fold lines, and then fold it into a cube.
3. Use scissors to cut six $2\frac{5}{8}$ " (67 mm) squares from the transparency film.
4. Glue them along the inside edges of each cube panel.

BLUE WINS ...

... SCISSORS CUT PAPER!



RED WINS ...

... ROCK CRUSHES SCISSORS!



Easily settle any family disagreement with these rock, paper, scissors dice. Simply choose your color (blue or red) and then let 'em roll. Remember: Rock beats scissors, scissors beats paper, and paper beats rock. The symbols will dictate the winner and loser.

MATERIALS

- Colored lightweight cardstock (red and blue)
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Craft knife and cutting mat
- Scissors
- Transparency film or any clear plastic
- Paper glue
- Black permanent marker



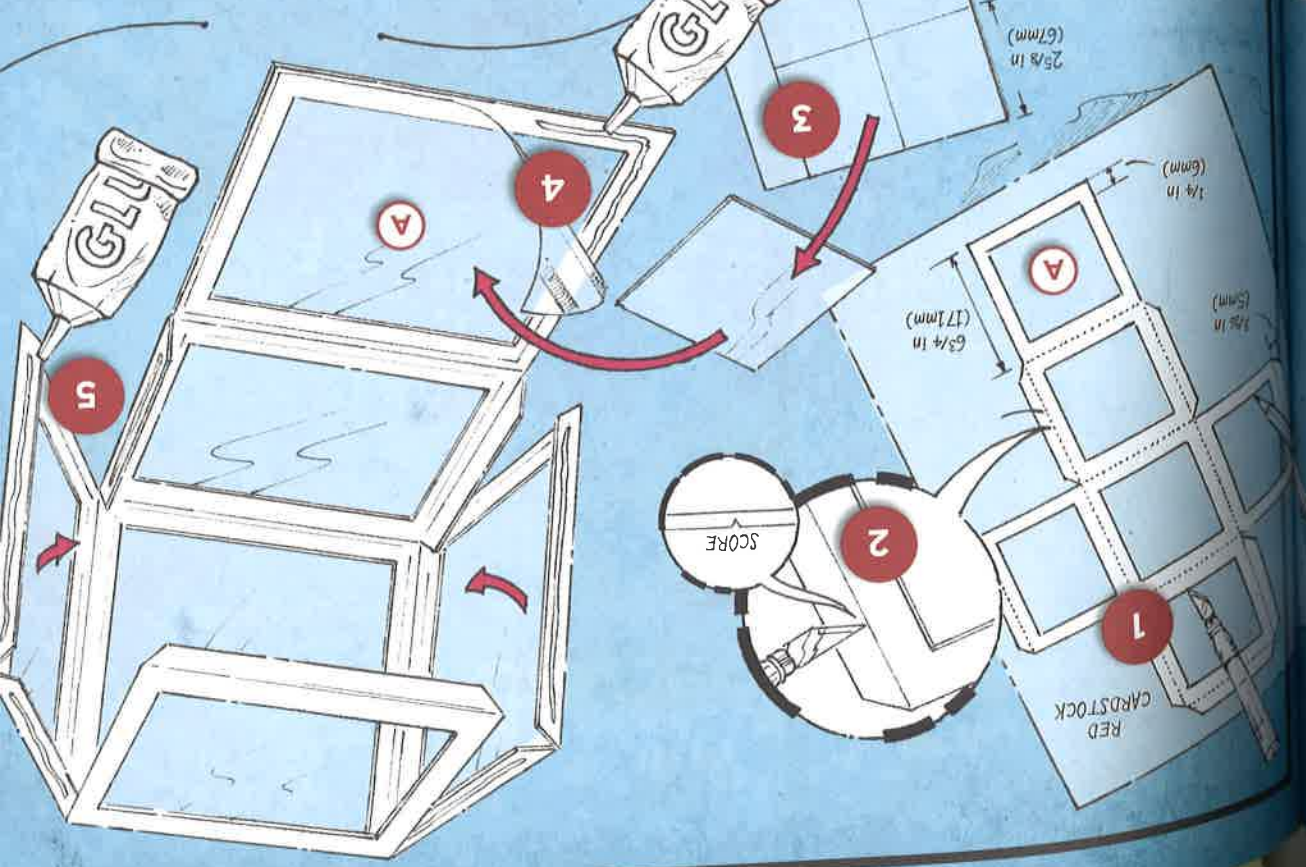
5. Apply glue to the paper tabs of the cube and join the sides. Glue the sides together except for the top. The cube should look like a box with an open lid.

6. Follow the cutting plan to cut a smaller cube from blue cardstock.

7. Use the black marker to draw paper, and scissors symbols on each) onto the sides of both cubes.

8. Place the small cube inside the large cube.

9. Apply glue to the remaining paper tabs of the large cube and the lid and let dry. Then cut the color, red or blue, and roll to see who wins!
